Head of Primary Message

January 24th, was the International Day of Education. This day was established by the United Nations General Assembly to celebrate the role of education in promoting peace and development. The theme for this year's celebration is "learning for lasting peace"

Education is a fundamental human right that should be accessible to all. However, there are still millions of children, youth and adults who are out of school or illiterate. This year's celebration aims to highlight the importance of inclusive and equitable quality education and lifelong opportunities for all.

To mark this day, UNESCO and UNICEF in sub-Saharan Africa have called for transforming education to foster peace. They believe that education is central to countering hate speech, which has become a growing concern in recent years. The Learning Planet Festival, a four-day event that celebrates the International Day of Education, is also taking place from January 24th to January 27th.

And finally, our POET TREE is growing and growing - come and see for yourself!










Year 5

Year 5 has started looking at a number of explorers. We began by researching different explorers and then, as a class, we investigated the life of one of the most famous explorers in history, Christopher Columbus. Year 4

PE NEWS: Fabulous Football

On Saturday 20th January, BSL entertained a very talented Lycee Français Lome for our first football matches. In front of a supportive crowd, there were fantastic examples of free flowing football and great sportsmanship between the two teams.

Game 1 - BSL 1-2 LFL

The first game of the day was between the younger teams. The game started at a quick pace with both goalkeepers being tested early on. BSL broke the deadlock through a speculative attempt by Caleb (Y4), scoring straight from a corner after the goalkeeper was put under pressure by the BSL forwards.

The second half saw LFL on the front foot with a number of great shots being blocked by the BSL defence. After two quick goals, BSL were behind but continued to push forward in search of an equaliser. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be on the day and a tight match was pipped by the away team.

Game 2 - BSL 0-0 LFL

This was one of the most entertaining 0-0 fixtures that has been seen recently. Both teams played great passing football with the two goalkeepers making remarkable saves to keep their teams in the game. Nael (Y5) and Beni (Y6) linked up in midfield to force the keeper into last ditch saves. Caleb (Y5) was a rock in defence, putting his body in front of a number of shots.

Whilst the game finished 0-0, this demonstrated football at its finest with both teams playing wonderful passing football.

Game 3 - BSL 2-3 LFL

The game started with a young BSL team made up of predominantly Year 2 and 3 pupils playing remarkably well against a more experienced LFL team. Some wonderful attacking play by LFL saw them race into a 0-3 lead. Coach Ado made some changes and this saw an upturn in fortunes for the home team. Kieran (Y5) scored arguably the goal of the day with a mazy dribble through the LFL defence to smash the ball into the top corner. This saw the tide turn and constant pressure saw a quick second goal by Ali (Y2) to set up a grandstand finish. The LFL defenders made some fantastic last ditch tackles to keep the BSL attackers out. The game ended 2-3 to the visitors but the BSL players demonstrated great resilience to keep battling right to the end.

Game 4 - BSL 7-0 LFL

The last game of the afternoon saw the BSL attackers click. Two quick fire goals by Ali (Y6) gave the BSL players confidence. A superb finish by Marvin (Y6) and a sumptuous goal by Nathan (Y7) gave the BSL an unassailable lead going into half-time. Wonderful finishes by Joachim (Y7) and Aviel (Y7) added gloss to the superb performance. It was great to see Hassan (Y5) cap his display with a fine goal to give the home team a deserved 7-0 win over their rivals.

The day was a fantastic advert for school football in Lome and a big thank you to Mr Naqvi, Mr Aryee, Coach Idris and Coach Ado for organising the event. A special thank you to Mrs Anquandah and the Year 12s for keeping us refreshed on the day.. We will be looking forward to more fixtures between the two schools and a special thank you to the parents for their wonderful support on the day.

Spotlight Biography Prof. Mulatu Lemma Ph. D

Professor Mulatu Lemma, Ph.D. Mathematics Professor at Savannah State University has been selected as Top Professor of the Year 2023 by the International Association of Top Professionals (IAOTP). He was just honoured at IAOTP's annual awards gala which was held at the NYC Plaza Hotel.

With more than 30 years of experience as a seasoned and trusted Professor, Mulatu Lemma has certainly proven himself as an accomplished professional and expert in the field of education. Professor Lemma has been teaching mathematics at Savannah State University for 28 years. He has previously dedicated five years to teaching and mentoring at Awash Junior College in Ethiopia.

Dr Lemma's unwavering passion for mathematics traces its roots back to his formative years, serving as a driving force behind his decision to embark on a professional journey dedicated to sharing this enthusiasm with others. He has dedicated his career to increasing the representation of minorities in mathematics and other STEM fields through the impactful practice of mentoring. He has consistently shown a solid dedication to mentoring activities in mathematics, specifically focused on minority students with an inclination toward math. His goal is to provide them with a solid foundation to support their success in school and their future careers. His objective is to produce a new generation of highly skilled mathematics students through active mentoring programs. Dr Lemma is deeply committed to mentoring students, guiding them in developing self-confidence, self-esteem, and research experience.

Before embarking on his career, Dr Lemma earned a Bachelor of Arts from Addis Ababa University in 1977. He continued his studies and obtained a Master of Arts in applied mathematics in 1982 and a Master of Arts in pure mathematics in 1993. He completed his doctoral studies at Kent State University in 1994.

Throughout his illustrious career, Lemma has received awards, accolades and was recognized for his outstanding leadership as a mathematics professor and mentor. Dr Lemma has received various awards for his achievements throughout his career. In 2020, Professor Lemma was honoured with the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science, Mathematics, and Engineering Mentoring. The award recognizes individuals who have made substantial contributions to mentoring and supporting the future workforce in the fields of science, technology, mathematics, and engineering.

Although Professor Lemma received many other awards, he considers the mentorship award the most meaningful. Some other awards include Dr Lemma being honoured as **Distinguished** Professor at Savannah State University. He received the University System of Georgia Board of Regents Teaching Excellence Award for Faculty in Regional and State Universities; he was recognized as the Georgia Professor of the Year the following year and was one of the most highly awarded professors in Georgia.

Professor Lemma also introduced the Mulatu Numbers to the world's mathematical community. Mulatu Numbers are integral sequences of the following numbers: 4, 1, 5,6,11,17,28,45...These numbers have fascinating patterns and features.


Looking back, Professor Lemma attributes his success to his perseverance, research, work ethic, and the mentors he has had along the way. When he is not working, he enjoys spending time with his family. For the future, he hopes to continue to mentor his students and inspire them in the field of Mathematics. Up to now, he published more than 200 papers on per reviewed journals.


