### **History of Togo**

The first shot fired by the British army during the First World War was not on the Western Front but in the tiny West African country of Togo, then called Togoland. It took place on 7 August 1914, three days after Britain declared war on Germany. Responding to shots fired by the German-led police force, Lance Corporal Alhaji Grunshi of the Gold Coast Regiment fired back. He went on to serve in the British Army in two further campaigns in Africa – Kamerun and East Africa – rising to the rank of Company Sergeant Major, and survived the

# A Message from the Head of School

Dear parents, guardians and students,

Canadian educator Lori Gard highlighted caring as the most important thing a teacher can do for her or his pupils. "At the end of the day," Ms Gard writes, "most students won't remember what amazing lesson plans teachers have created. They won't remember how organised their bulletin boards are. How straight and neat are the desk rows. But they will remember their teachers. Their kindness. Their empathy. Their care and concern. They will remember that their teacher took the time to listen. They stopped to ask them how they were. How they really were."

## Poppy Appeal 2023

At 11 o'clock in the morning of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, the First World War -known at the time as the Great War or the War to end all wars- came to an end. The poppy is the enduring symbol of remembrance of the First World War. It is strongly linked with Armistice Day (11 November), but the poppy's origin as a popular symbol of remembrance lies in the landscapes of the First World War.

Poppies were a common sight, especially on the Western Front. They flourished in the soil churned up by the fighting and shelling. The flower provided Canadian doctor **John McCrae** with inspiration for his poem 'In Flanders Fields', which he wrote whilst serving in Ypres in 1915. The poppy continues to be sold worldwide to raise money and to remember those who lost their lives in the First World War and in subsequent conflicts.

Poppies will be on sale all next week for 1000 cfa or you can donate more. The money will be shared between The Royal British Legion and soldiers families in Togo.


