School Uniform

As part of the identity of the British School of Lomé all learners are required to wear a school uniform. The uniform enhances the learning atmosphere and increases a sense of pride and community. BSL learners are expected to dress in a way that demonstrates a positive self-image and an attitude of excellence in performance and achievement. Smartness and cleanliness should be observed at all times.

Please consult the Handbook for guidance on correct uniform. Uniform will be regularly checked and students spoken to if necessary. I ask that as parents you support us in the endeavour to help the students look smart and bring about pride in our school.

Lateness to School

We know there is lots of traffic in Lome in the mornings and sometimes it is difficult to arrive at school on time. We are encouraging our students to get every day and every lesson off to a positive start. Being late affects them, it affects the teacher and the fellow students. Lateness to school will be closely recorded and if necessary, a meeting with the parents may be called.

Use of Personal Laptops

As part of our commitment to Safeguarding learners and to protect our school wifi system we have made some necessary changes to our Digital Devices Policy. This includes the use of personal laptops and telephones.

As a staff we believe that students in Year 7 to 9 do not need laptops in the classroom as we want the students to focus more on the teaching and minimize distractions. We also have class sets of Chrome books that will be used in the classroom if necessary. Therefore, we ask that students in Year 7 to 9 do not bring a laptop into school,

We encourage learners in Year 10 - 13 to bring their laptops to school as they can be fantastic learning tools and we want to teach independence and responsibility. Students and parents will need to sign an acceptable use agreement which will outline the conditions of their use.

Use of Telephones at School

<u>Telephones must never be seen in the school</u>. There is strictly no exception to this rule and if a teacher takes a phone, it will not be returned. Parents will need to collect.

For Parents the use of telephones within the school for photography, recording or video is strictly forbidden and if caught will lead to further action being taken
